Black Country Women's Aid Dudley Domestic Violence and Abuse Support Service	Offers the nationally recognised Independent Domestic Violence Advice (IDVA) Service, providing support, advocacy, safety planning, and risk management to victims of domestic abuse (including Forced Marriage and Honour Based Abuse) assessed as being at medium to high-risk of harm according to the DASH risk assessment tool. BCWA also support victims of Stalking and Sexual Violence. The service also offers advice, training and support to health professionals, relevant third sector organisations and police.	16+	ALL	Self-referral: Victims can refer themselves to the service, and we will complete a DASH to assess service eligibility. Depending on the level of risk service users will either be allocated an IDVA or signposted to appropriate services. Agency Referrals: agencies will need to complete a referral form and undertake their own DASH risk assessment to determine eligibility for service.
