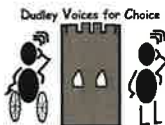

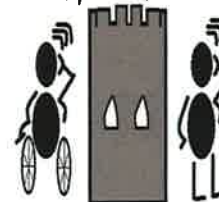

What are Safe Places ?

Safe Places are where you can go and get help if you are:

- Upset, scared or angry about something that has happened while you are out.
- A victim of hate crime
- If you see a hate crime



How can you get help at a Safe Place ?

A safe place will have stickers on its windows to show that they are a Safe Place.



What is Hate Crime ?

Hate crime is when someone treats you badly because they don't like something about you. This may be:

- Your disability
- Your religion
- The country you are from
- Who you have a relationship with.



If you need help or assistance you can show your 'I need help' card to the person who is working at the Safe Place. If you have not got your card you can still get help



Hate Crime can be things like:

- Someone hurting you
- Someone taking or breaking your things
- Someone calling you nasty names
- Someone making you feel scared or unsafe.



Tell them what has happened or what you need help with.

If you want them to call your family or friend the number will be on your card. The person at the Safe Place can call a police community support officer if a crime has been committed.
